First half 2007 sales revenue: up 6.7% to €5.4 billion

Backlog at June 30, 2007: €33.5 billion, or three years of sales revenue

The AREVA group's backlog as of June 30, 2007 was €33.5 billion, up 31% compared with that of December 31, 2006. On average, the Group's backlog increased by more than 20% annually over the last three years. It is now at the highest level since AREVA was established in 2001. All divisions contributed to this performance:

- The Front End division signed in particular a major enrichment contract with KHNP (South Korea), a fuel supply contract with EDF covering the 2008-2012 period and other significant contracts with Japanese and Swedish utilities.
- The Reactors and Services division added the Flamanville 3 EPR, ordered by EDF, to the backlog. Flamanville 3 is AREVA's 100th reactor order.
- The Back End division also concluded a major contract with Sogin to treat used fuel stored at Italian nuclear sites.
- The Transmission & Distribution division continued to record strong growth. New orders were up 24% compared with the first half of 2006 (+25.1% like-for-like) Important contracts were signed in the Middle East, Russia and with large industrial users of electricity.

First half 2007 sales revenue was up 6.7% (+6.4% like-for-like) to \in 5 373 million, compared with \in 5 036 million for the first half of 2006. Major developments in the first half of 2007 include:

- Sales revenue was down 2.8% to €1 342 million in the Front End division (-3.6% like-for-like) due to uneven distribution of deliveries in the Fuel business unfavorable during the period. This timing issue has no impact on projected annual growth. The division continues to benefit from a gradual price increase for long-term uranium supply contracts.
- Sales revenue was up 4.8% to €1 154 million in the Reactors and Services division (+3% like-for-like). The Services business unit, especially, was a major contributor to growth on all its markets after a 2006 fiscal year marked by a weak demand. The start of construction of a second EPR reactor for EDF, Flamanville 3, also contributed to the division's revenue increase.
- Sales revenue for the Back End division was steady in comparison to the first half of 2006, at €856 million.
- The Transmission & Distribution division recorded growth of 18.8% (+19.5% like-for-like). For the first time, the T&D division recognized more than €2 billion in sales revenue for a six-month period, at €2 021 million. The Systems and Products business units contributed significantly to growth in all regions.

Outlook: The group confirms its strong sales revenue growth objective for 2007.
