



Policy on the supply chain of minerals and metals potentially originating from conflict-affected or high-risk areas (Orano MED)

At Orano MED, we recognize the importance of promoting responsible sourcing practices.

In accordance with Regulation (EU) 2017/821 on the duty of care for importers of gold, tin, tantalum and tungsten (3TG) and the recommendations of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), we are committed to implementing measures to ensure that our mineral supply chain adheres to the principles of due diligence.

The trade in minerals such as tungsten, tantalum, tin and gold from conflict-affected or high-risk areas is of major concern due to its potential role in funding armed groups, human rights abuses and other illicit activities.

In addition, mining in these areas can cause considerable environmental damage and expose workers to unsafe working conditions.

In line with our values and our Code of Ethics and Business Conduct, we are committed to compliance with international standards and transparency in our supply chain.

We commit to avoid any involvement, direct or indirect, in serious human rights violations, the financing of armed groups, abuses committed by public or private security forces, corruption, money laundering, the false declarations of origin of minerals as well as the non-payment of taxes, duties and royalties.

As such, our policy aims to:

- Mapping, preventing and mitigating risks related to our mineral supply chain;
- Implement a traceability and transparency system to detect the origin of the minerals we use, particularly tungsten;
- Integrating responsible sourcing requirements into our processes and contractual relationships;
- Carry out, as appropriate, independent audits of our suppliers to ensure compliance with our responsible sourcing requirements as well as ethical and environmental standards;
- Implement corrective measures in the event of a proven risk, which can go as far as breaking the business relationship;
- Prioritize French or European supplies, when possible;
- Train internal actors on the subject and the provisions in place;



- Maintain an alert mechanism to report any violation or risk related to our supply chain (<https://oranoethic.signalement.net/>) ;
- Communicate transparently about our actions and results.

This policy is subject to regular monitoring and is part of a process of continuous improvement. We are committed to adapting our practices in line with the evolution of international regulations and best practices for responsible mineral sourcing.
